Alberta

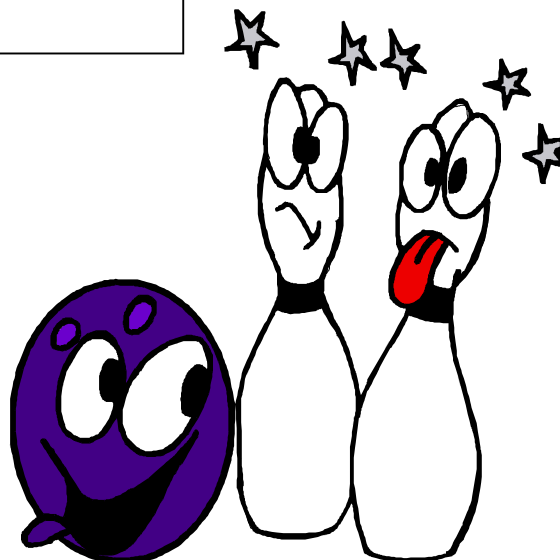
