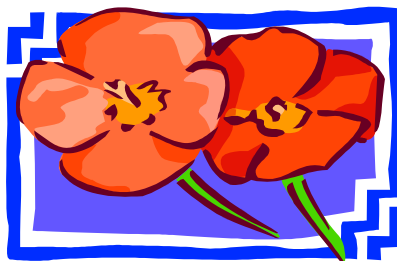
Vers qui peuvent se tourner les jeunes de cinq à vingt ans qui ont besoin de parler à quelqu'un?
